ACCESSIBILITY CAMPING & SERVICES

The Gympie Music Muster has a designated Accessibility Campground for those who hold a valid Australian Disability Parking Permit. As our event grows, we have implemented changes to ensure everyone who registers understands the facilities offered and requirements to secure a site. The Campground is in the festival's prime camping area, and each site is approx. 100m² with easy access to and from the festival precinct. There will be exclusive accessible toilets and showers. Disability amenities will also be available in Banjo's Campground for those wishing to book accommodation in Banjos.

We want everyone to have the best experience at the Muster and have found most of those staying in this campground have equipment that requires electricity, with this in mind if you require a powered site in the accessibility campground a subsidised fee of \$160.00 will be charged to you. There are unpowered sites available at no cost also.

Please note there are limited sites available, and the above requirements need to be fully completed for your site to be secured.

To secure your site in the Accessible Camp Area you will need the following:

1. Fully paid **4-day ticket** to the festival. Note: Payment plans will need to be finalised by the 30 April 2025. [CLICK HERE FOR MAP](#)
2. A copy of your Parking Permit – example below (next page)

3. Payment of \$160.00 if you require a powered site. (a link to payment options will be sent, when confirmed)

A dedicated accessibility bus will run from the accessibility campground to the festival gates. It is also available for patrons camping outside the accessibility campgrounds and to shuttle people from the disability carpark at the Front Gate. Accessibility coordinators will assist in catching the bus.

Other accessible services:

- Wheelchair accessible viewing platforms are located to the right and left sides of the main stage.
- Wheelchair accessible toilets are located at 4 sites within the entertainment precinct.
- Assistant Animals are welcome at the Gympie Muster, please see the fact sheet relating to registration of your AA.

GENERAL CAMPGROUND RULES APPLY

Camping

- Campsites are approximately 100m².
- Maximum 6 people per camp site.
- Tents must be at least 2m apart.
- No dogs in the campground. This applies from 31 July 2025. Certified assistance dogs only are allowed refer to the Animals at the Muster fact sheet.
- Alford's Flat, Alford's Pocket and Blue Gum Ridge are quiet camping ONLY – No loud music/parties or whip cracking allowed after 10pm – 7am.
- Generators are not permitted between 10pm and 6am. Please consider your neighbours.
- All amenities will gradually be available from August 23, 2025.
- Campers must vacate campsite by Tuesday 2 September 2025.
- DO NOT ENTER WATER BODIES, IF YOU ENTER ANY WATER BODY THEN IT IS AT YOUR OWN RISK.

Vehicles

- Speed limit is 10km/hr.
- No unregistered vehicles are to be used on site. i.e. golf carts, side by sides unless authorised by GML. Mobility scooters are permitted.
- All road rules apply.
- No vehicle movement in the campgrounds between 5pm and 7am unless you are leaving the festival. Emergencies excluded. GML accepts no responsibility for any personal injury or property damage caused by patron vehicles.
- Disability parking at the bus turnaround is for day ticket holders with wheelchairs.
- Disability campers are to use the disability courtesy bus.
- Cars parked in the disabled carpark without the appropriate stickers will be towed.

Fires

- No fires between 9am and 4pm. All fires will be extinguished during the day.
- Further fire bans may apply on advice from QFS.
- All fires must be contained within a fire ring.
- 4m distance must be kept between a fire and tents or vehicles.
- Nothing is to be put in a fire ring that doesn't burn. i.e. metal.

Emergencies

- Make yourself familiar with the closest emergency meeting point. These sites are marked with a name and number to quote in the event of an emergency.
- Medical emergencies: In the first instance call the on-site Medic. The number is displayed on the emergency call point sign. If no response, then call 000.
- On-site medic is available from Saturday 23 August 2025.
- A Security number is also displayed for all other emergencies.

Buses

- Our bus timetable will be finalised and released in 2025.
